
For over 20 years, Jamila has supported mission-based organizations in the non-profit and cooperative business sectors.

#### Map of Philly Co-ops









#### **Study Circles**

#### Study Track:

works with groups to explore community ownership and cooperative enterprise through study over the course of six months.

#### Build Track:

works with groups, from previous Study Circles cohorts, who are interested in continuing to develop their idea with the support of PACA staff through a collaboratively designed TA contract.

#### **Seed Commons**

a national network of locally rooted, non-extractive loan funds that aims to bring the power of big finance under community control.

#### **Policy & Advocacy**

A voice on behalf of co-ops & credit unions with government and the public; promotion of legislative and administrative initiatives to support cooperative businesses and development.

#### **OVERVIEW, Part 1**

- Consumer-owned Cooperative
- Established in Mt. Airy (NW Philadelphia) in 1973 as a produce buying club
- Organized both as a Pennsylvania Non-Profit Corporation and a Pennsylvania Cooperative
- 11,000+ Member-Owner Households representing 25,000+ individuals
- Stores are open to the public. 79% member shoppers; 21% non-members

#### **OVERVIEW, Part 2**

- Mt. Airy 3 stores (main store, Across the Way, Mercantile)
- Chestnut Hill (opened 2010) 2 stores (main store, Next Door)
- Ambler (opened 2017)
- Germantown (anticipated opening date late 2023)
- 2 Farms (Awbury Arboretum and Saul High School for Agriculture, approx. 5 acres in total)
- Community Newspaper (The Shuttle, published 10 times annually)
- Warehouse (Erie Ave, Juniata Park)
- Annual Revenue approximately \$38 million
- 250 employees
- 300+ local vendors (150 miles from City Hall)

#### **Fast Growing Out-of-Towners**


Philadelphia has historically been dominated by regional chains and franchises (Acme, Shop Rite, Fresh Grocer, IGA, etc.). The marketplace is seeing tremendous outside investment from new competitors fueled by private equity:

- Heirloom & Giant (Ahold Delhaize, market capitalization = \$31.17 Billion)
- The Fresh Market (Cencosud)
- Sprouts Farmers Market
- Aldi & Lidl
- Dollar General & Dollar Tree
- Mom's Organics
- Wegmans
- Whole Foods & Amazon Fresh (Amazon)

#### Weavers Way Member Loans have fueled our growth and leveraged additional capital

- Chestnut Hill (2009): \$900,000
- Ambler (2016): \$1.5 million
- Germantown (2022): \$2.2 million
